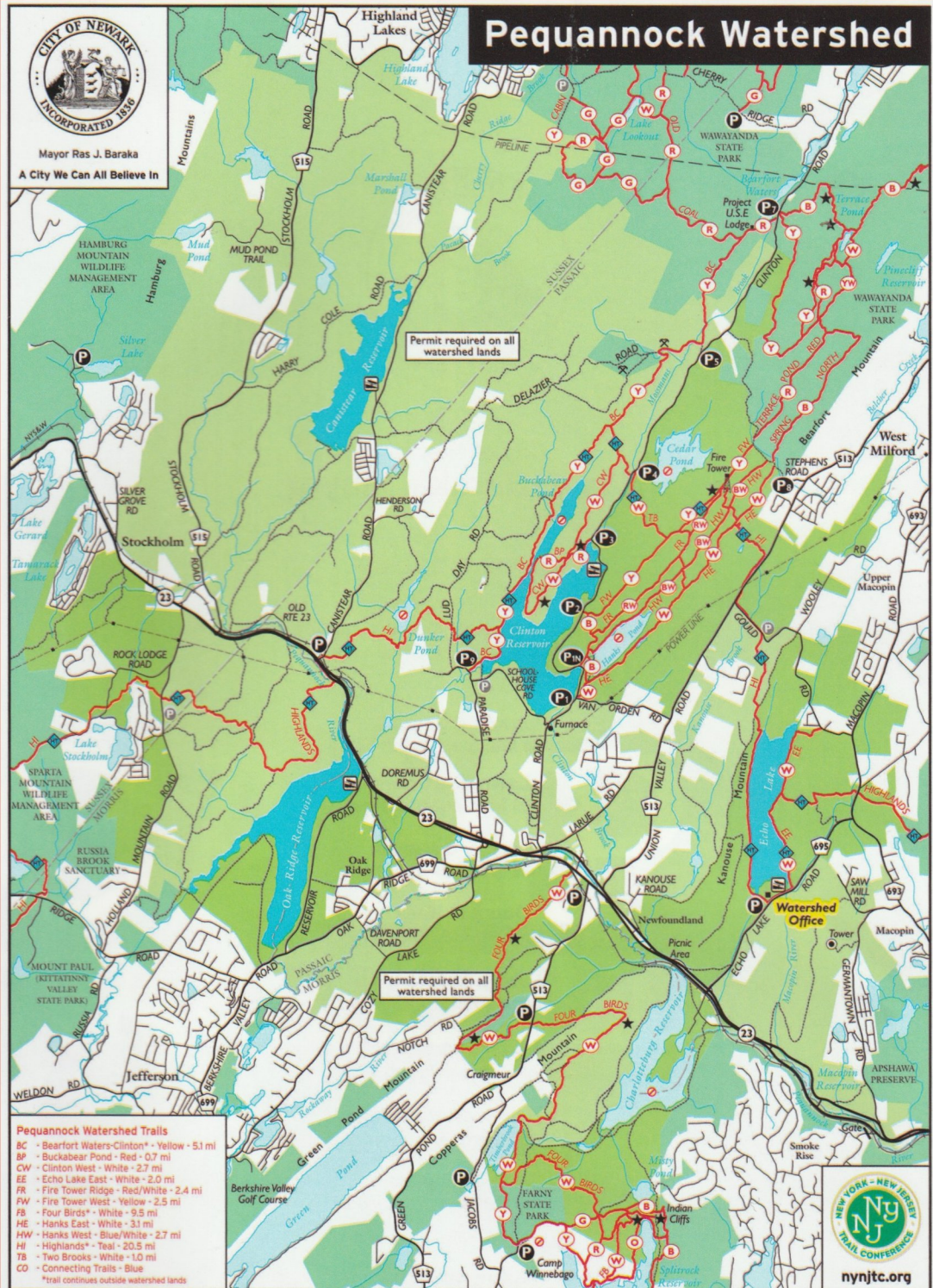


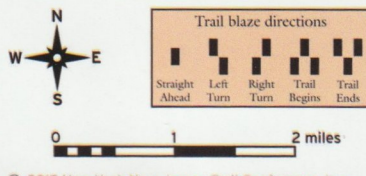

- Fishing and boat launching are permitted only at reservoirs shaded with a darker blue color.
